THE Key Document Must be made daily Must be complete Must be sent to the Home Office The LINK between the field and home office Must be regularly reviewed by management

- Daily

- Equipment utilized
- Activities Performed
- Labor hours
- Standby time

Time & Material Tickets

- Use on EVERY change order
- Use a separate T&M for <u>each</u> change
- Documents extra costs
- Get them signed by the contractor

Claim Files

- Segregate records for identified claims.
- Track and Segregate Time and Costs for identified claims and extra work.
- Get work tickets signed.

Photographs

- When
 - At least once a week
 - All changes
 - All completed work/milestones
 - All impacts of the general or other trades
 - Keep a camera handy at all times

Photographs

- How?
 - At least once per week
 - Stand in same physical location
 - Looking in the same direction
 - Use camera with date stamp
 - Use measuring devices and objects to indicate scale
 - Keep camera handy at all times

- Timely Transmitted
- State Facts
- Explain the Resulting Impact

Impacts

- Standby or idle time for equipment,
- Productivity impacts are occurring,
- Acceleration is ordered or is occurring,
- Changes are ordered or are occurring,
- Extra work is directed/ordered, and/or
- Delays are occurring.

- Never make notice & documentation assumptions
 - Frequently a condition precedent to recovery
 - Strictly enforced
 - Prejudice will result in a lost claim
 - Memory and Common Knowledge ≠ Written Notice
